FaithMB: I will check out the transcripts

FaithMB: no, I haven't heard of Cagle

FaithMB: I used Ben Franklin's cartoons and some current ones so that the kids could get an idea about how to use pol. cartoons. I will check it out.

BJB2: there is a teacher's page

BJB2: all kinds of cartoons. lots of editorial cartoons

FaithMB: that looks great. some of the kids just drew pictures of soldiers

MarkGa: another good resource that is open all year round is BAW (be a webhead) at yahoo groups

BJB2: try this one, Eileen and Faith
