**BJB2** . o O ( and do we need to define literacy? )

**GretchenS**: It is one of the different learning styles

**MeredithJ**: it all starts with the ABC's, doesn't it?

**BJB2**: anyone else?

**IreneMe**: it's way to get students involved and remember things like the ABC's

**BJB2**: ok...I'm going to be providing some resources for you that take a look at all of those perspectives...

**BJB2**: music and help children learn word patters and language

**BJB2**: this is visual literacy

SusanR: in the early grade students learn to read by singing songs, learning chants etc

**BJB2**: but, music can also help children learn pattern, rhythm, pitch, etc.

**BJB2**: this is called aural literacy and is important in developing listening skills

**BJB2**: In 1982, the international agency UNESCO declared, "We must prepare young people for living in a world of images, words and sounds."

BJB2: over 20 years ago!

**BJB2**: What we hear -- especially music --plays a huge role in human interpretation of media messages.

**BJB2**: take a look at this site. When I give you the url, click on the hyperlink. You may need to hold down the ctrl key if you have a pop up blocker

**BJB2**: much study has been done on the power of music...to soothe, persuade, motivate

**BJB2**: Adrian North, whose particular research interests include music and consumer behaviour and music in adolescence, is a member of the Music Psychology Research Group at the University of Leicester, UK.

**BJB2**: Using songs is a wonderful way to make the target language accessible to language learners. It is a universal medium, and speaks volumes about cultural origin, language patterns, and usage. The power that songs contain is underscored by George Jellinek (WQXR-FM): "The history of a people is found in its songs." On a more basic level, music and songs are simply the stuff that life is made of: "Give me a laundry list and I'll set it to music" (Gioacchino Antonio Rossini).

**BJB2**: Songs can be used at all levels and for a wide variety of activities and purposes such as comprehension, vocabulary introduction, illustration or recognition of grammar structures, and reinforcement of topics.

**BJB2**: The rhythm and melody of songs can make the words and expressions easier to remember and more enjoyable for students than other sorts of texts
