BjB: you have a pop up blocker, Magda. ctrl overrides the pop up blocker

MagdaG: that must be the problem

BjB: this site should give you some fun ideas. I'll bet the kids can make up their own stories

KellyAC: What a great site for the English Learners. They can be involved in making a story and following along with the story too. This kind of reminds me of training I went to where you use drawings to teach lessons (GLAD)

BjB: cool, Kelly

BjB: can also integrate math (shapes) as well as writing

BjB: even the little ones have a life story...the next site is Life Storywriting Network
