CynthiaLC: library of congress

EmilyW: where are the writing prompts?

CynthiaLC: under teacher resources

CynthiaLC: they've now changed it to learning resources

BjB: I don't think you can even see that unless you log in

CynthiaLC: has a lightbulb as an icon for it

CynthiaLC: exactly, she may have an account

CynthiaLC: or you can set up a temporary one when you go to the website

EmilyW: I don't have an account

BjB sets up a trial account

JeffC joined the room.

BjB waves hi to Jeff

JeffC: hi

CynthiaLC: hi

BjB: we're discussing United streaming, Jeff

CynthiaLC: do you use it?

BjB: as a good resource for writing prompts across the curriculum

JeffC: nope

CynthiaLC: they have good material and are continuing to add to it

JeffC: url?

JeffC: why pay? <u>http://www.ourmedia.org</u> is free

CynthiaLC: I didn't even know about that one

CynthiaLC: can you download the media and put it in a powerpoint?

JeffC: It's a collaborative... and searchable... I imagine that fair use applies.

CynthiaLC: I'm sure

EmilyW: unitedstreaming is more for educators

JeffC: It's collection might not be as extensive as unitedstreaming... yet... but... it will grow with time.

CynthiaLC: isn't that what we are?

EmilyW: I was telling Jeff

EmilyW: the other site is for anyone

EmilyW: this site is great

JeffC: If it costs money... it's an issue for K-12 (and other) educators.

CynthiaLC: I understand that

EmilyW: what other tools are there besides the writing prompts?

BjB: there are lessons and tutorials, Em

CynthiaLC: online quiz center for educators

CynthiaLC: where you can create quizzes and your students can take them online

CynthiaLC: automatically scores them for you, problem is, technology is not always the friendliest thing in an educator's life

CynthiaLC: any questions about digital photography?

CynthiaLC: free resources?

BjB: do you have other free resources, Cynthia?

BjB: Jeff, united streaming has images and multimedia resources

CynthiaLC: www.picasa.com is a good free resource for creating webpages, etc.

CynthiaLC: and altering digital images

CynthiaLC: love this program

CynthiaLC: similar to adobe photoshop elements, but easier to use plus free

BjB: similar to photoshop tools?

BjB laughs..thanks

CynthiaLC: not that fancy but you know what I'm saying

CynthiaLC: you can't beat FREE!

BjB nods and agrees. I doubt that many people can actually use all the photoshop tools and features

JeffC: afks

BjB: what about digital storytelling?

CynthiaLC: we had a huge discussion about this with the department of ed the other day

BjB listens

CynthiaLC: but we referred to it in a blog format

CynthiaLC: is that what you're talking about?

CynthiaLC: I'm curious

CynthiaLC: one thing about blogs, so many school systems restrict their use

CynthiaLC: this would probably pass

BjB: If a school blocks blogs, they might want to try the Tapped In student campus as a safe place to bring kids

BjB: and use the threaded discussion boards as a 'training' blog

CynthiaLC: nice, see I've learned more here today than I have in my 4 years teaching technology

CynthiaLC: goodness

BjB: here's another resource http://www.headsonfire.org/hof/index.html

CynthiaLC: is this a resource students can use?

BjB: this is the one I was looking for...when I mentioned therapeutic value of digital stories <u>http://www.silencespeaks.org/index.html</u>

BjB: I would imagine students could use it.
