JaredHe: I am in LA

**JaredHe**: Do you teach?

**BJB2**: yes, I'm an art teacher. And you?

**JaredHe**: Very cool. I am dealing with my credential program-and have to deal with stringent state regulations for credentialing

**JaredHe**: BJ it has been a nightmare dealing with California regulations

**JaredHe**: Kelly what city are you in?

**KellyN**: Houston

**JaredHe**: Ok-how are the state rules there for credential and fulfilling requirements?

**BJB2**: Jared, most states have pretty stringent rules any more

**JaredHe**: got you BJ-I have just thought about the process because I am more recent to being in the program

**JaredHe**: BJ have you needed to attend many hours of pre-service at your school?

BJB2: state requires a certain number of Act 48 hours which are inservice type hours

**BJB2**: what will you be teaching, Jared?

JaredHe: English BJ

**JaredHe**: I meant inservice hours BJ-I am getting the lingo together still. What are the hours devoted to?

**BJB2**: cool. Are you here as part of the requirements for a course?

JaredHe: yes

**BJB2**: professional development

**JaredHe**: ok-so the pro dev is for things like computer integration for teaching BJ?

**BJB2**: yes, that would qualify

**JaredHe**: I am taking a computer class on that material for this semester

**JaredHe**: we have to do a technology plan for a whole school

**BJB2**: are you enjoying the class? Sounds like a lot of work

**JaredHe**: it is lots of work but I think it is very interesting

JaredHe: useful

BJB2 nods

**BJB2**: many teachers are very lacking in integrating tech into the curriculum

**JaredHe**: but I think this inclusion policy is a problem in general ed in the classrooms

**BJB2**: how so?

**JaredHe**: computer integration is great but it needs to be gradually increased in its implementation for teaching

**BJB2**: teachers need to be shown how to do that, too

**BJB2**: and admin has to model tech use

**JaredHe**: inclusion: to teach special ed at same time, it seems that you have to constantly alter your lesson plans several ways within the same lesson plan

**JaredHe**: yes that is a good point on tech BJ

**BJB2**: Jared, it helps if you work closely with the special ed teachers

**JeffC**: My son's taking the computer... and then we'll be off to rehearsal... if people could either pop in some links to rss feeds (educational)... I'll add them to my blog later.

JeffC afks

JaredHe: I will learn that BJ so correct

BJB2: there is a special ed group here in Tapped In, Jared

**JaredHe**: for me, being new, it will be an adjustment BJ

**JaredHe**: I will try that later

JaredHe: back to computer issue

**JaredHe**: BJ do you use much technology in your classroom?

**BJB2**: I try

**JaredHe**: what do you feel most comfortable with in teaching art?

**JaredHe**: what grade do you teach art to?

BJB2: Jared, I teach in a juvenile correctional facility. Lots of special ed.

**JaredHe**: so your ages vary greatly?

**BJB2**: from 11-18

**JaredHe**: what technology do you feel most comfortable in teaching art?

**BJB2**: I use demonstration tech and basic draw programs

**BJB2** . o O ( not too sophisticated )

**JaredHe**: cool, which draw program do you use? I figured it wouldn't be too sophisticated

**BJB2**: I'm comfortable using anything that gets the job done

**BJB2**: I try to use basic programs that come with most computers

**JaredHe**: ok, I am prospectively thinking about programs for teaching literature for middle school

**BJB2**: that way, the kids can access the programs from any computer

JaredHe: superb

**BJB2**: what programs are you thinking about?

**JaredHe**: I like the idea of talking storybooks that I have read about

**JaredHe**: I am thinking about Inspiration

**BJB2** . o O ( we've had teachers bring in students from different classes and schools to hold literature circles )

**BJB2**: Inspiration is wonderful

**JaredHe**: tell me about that please

**JaredHe**: more about Inspiration

JaredHe: please

**BJB2**: I have the program on my computer at school...

**BJB2**: but don't have time to play with it and really learn how to use it

**BJB2**: I like that you can draw a concept map and then convert it to an outline...

**BJB2**: and vice versa

**JaredHe**: darn-I have heard how great it is for students to organize thoughts

JaredHe: cool

**JaredHe**: I like the idea of the end result-as a launcher for students to write their first

draft

JaredHe: but as far as literature, I like your mentioning of kids coming in for lit circles

**BJB2** nods. Graphic organizers are great for that...and can be adapted for your inclusion students too

JaredHe: ok, then that would be a recommended purchase

BJB2 nods

**JaredHe**: I think the revision process in writing is hard for spec. ed students-what software do you think is good, if you know of one?

**AaronPC** joined the room.

BJB2: just writing on a word processor is good, Jared

BJB2: Hi, Aaron!

AaronPC: Hi there.

JaredHe: ok

**BJB2** . o O ( I was beginning to wonder if there was a blogstreams session today )

AaronPC: Oh...

**JaredHe**: hey Aaron

**AaronPC**: I wonder where Bee is this evening.

JaredHe: thanks BJB

AaronPC: Hi Jared, Jeff, Kelly, BJ

BJB2: I haven't heard from her, Aaron

**AaronPC**: She must be up to something with her family.

**JaredHe**: so you guys do this blogstream once per week?

**AaronPC**: Well...we try and make it every week.

**AaronPC**: Have you been by here before?

**JaredHe**: tell me more specifically what it's about?

JaredHe: I have not been here before

**AaronPC**: Well...it grew out of some weekly sessions we had early in the year...

**AaronPC**: during the EVO workshop on blogs in ESL/EFL...

AaronPC: and we decided to continue getting together and talking about...

**BJB2**: any clue what those letters mean, Jared?

**AaronPC**: the use of blogs, wikis, and other social tools each week.

JaredHe: nope

BJB2 grins

AaronPC: ooops

**BJB2**: ESL/EFL are English as a second lang/English as a foreign lang

JaredHe: ok

AaronPC: EVO is Electronic Village Online....a series of virtual workshops for

educators....

**JaredHe**: got it-well I am teaching an ESL class every day

**AaronPC**: and it is sponsored by TESOL.

**JaredHe**: so I have just that background

**JaredHe**: I have just read about TESOL

**AaronPC**: Great! Where do you teach?

JaredHe: I teach at a middle school in LA

JaredHe: I am also a TA there as well

**AaronPC**: Nice. Do you use the internet with your students?

**JaredHe**: and BJB has been very helpful even though I wasn't on the topic lol

**JaredHe**: I haven't used the internet for them yet

JaredHe: I should

**JaredHe**: I use CDs with music and other verbal lessons

AaronPC: Oh yes....my students love to listen to music in class too.

**BJB2**: blogs are a great way to learn language, Jared...any language

JaredHe: thanks BJ

**JaredHe**: I think that is very true

JaredHe: I have considered how they spur the thought process in writing

**JaredHe**: these students are very motivated in speaking, and not too bad on the writing skills

**BJB2**: great that they're interested in speaking. Perhaps Aaron can tell you about podcasts?

**AaronPC** wonders how many of them might be blogging already.

**JaredHe**: yes that would be great-what are podcasts?

**AaronPC**: Yeah, they might really like podcasting!

JaredHe: cool

**AaronPC**: Basically just audio recordings that the students make themselves and publish on the internet in the form of a blog.

**AaronPC**: Since the blog has an RSS feed, people can subscribe and listen.

**JaredHe**: very cool then you have their thought process in writing combined with an audio version of their thinking while they wrote

AaronPC: Exactly.

JaredHe: superb

**JaredHe**: this is available on the internet?

**AaronPC**: They can also listen on their mp3 players...like iPod, etc.

**ShawnS** joined the room.

AaronPC: Hi Shawn.

ShawnS: Hi Aaron

**BJB2** waves hi to Shawn

AaronPC: Yes...do a word search on podcasting, Jared, and explore it a bit.

JaredHe: great

BJB2: Aaron, Jeff is lurking. He was here earlier and left a message for you...

**AaronPC**: There are so many interesting recordings out there.

JaredHe: and I am sure I can find this in a websearch on Yahoo

BJB2: JeffC: if people could either pop in some links to rss feeds (educational)... I'll add

them to my blog later

JaredHe: thanks Aaron

**AaronPC**: I made a podcast with my students recently:

**AaronPC**: http://e-poche.net/conversations/?p=29

JaredHe: perfect I will bookmark it

**JaredHe**: my students respond to poems that have music to them so they can learn the

vocab

**JaredHe**: podcasting could work with that

**AaronPC**: Perfect...or they could write rap or their own rhymes, poems, etc.

**JaredHe**: oh the idea of that enhances the purpose

**JaredHe**: and they like the blues sound of the last poem we did

**JaredHe**: what subject do you teach Aaron?

**AaronPC**: I teach EFL at a university in Japan.

JaredHe: great

**JaredHe**: what city?

AaronPC: Kyoto

JaredHe: very nice

**AaronPC**: Have you been to Japan before?

**JaredHe**: I have not been there and that is oddly the next place I want to go

**JaredHe**: I have been to many countries

JaredHe: Japan is on my list

**AaronPC**: Shawn, Kelly....do you teach English too?

**AaronPC**: Well...if you come to Kyoto...please drop me a line.

JaredHe: I will

JaredHe: You are near Osaka?

ShawnS: Yes. I teach grade 8 English

**AaronPC**: Yes....Kyoto is about 40 min away by train.

JaredHe: I want to teach grade 8

JaredHe: My dad's stepbrother teaches English at the Univ of Osaka

JaredHe: EFL

**ShawnS**: Kids are great, if you appreciate the adolescent beast!

JaredHe: I do Shawn lol

**AaronPC**: Small world, eh?

BJB2 chuckles

**AaronPC**: Ahhh...the adolescent beast!

**JaredHe**: but I do prefer teaching EFL in college overseas

JaredHe: I think I would do well at that

**AaronPC**: Is English a second language for your students Shawn?

**ShawnS**: Love the poetry insight. I have the students create poetry anthologies in the spring

**ShawnS**: No. English is their first language though I do have many students who speak another language at home.

**AaronPC**: Wow...they must enjoy that. Do you ever use the internet with them?

AaronPC: Hi Regina.

JaredHe: Hi Regina
