LynneW: My name is Lynne Wolters - ed tech professor in Portland Oregon.

AmandaCG: I am here to get professional development credits for an educational class

DavidWe: I'm David Weksler. I'm a HelpDesk volunteer and I lead a math education discussion in Tapped In. I'm in New Jersey, close to Kathleen

AmandaCG: I will be teaching eighth grade science

AmandaCG: I graduate this spring

LynneW: Congratulations Amanda

DavidWe: Congratulations in advance, Amanda

LynneW smiles

AmandaCG: Thanks

LynneW: I don't know what happened - our guest speaker, Melanie Salisbury, has dropped off map. Hopefully she will return shortly.

CandyMo: hi, I am an elementary assistant principal in corpus texas, just chatting for a course grade, doctoral class

BJB2 smiles. You're all in for a treat...Lynne always shares such wonderful resources

Lynne W: How did you find out about our group meeting?

LynneW blushes

CandyMo: our professor

KJackieO: I was knocking about on TI and saw it.

LynneW: Yes

LynneW: This special interest group is Web 2.0 Tools for Schools.

LynneW: Within this room are a wide array of new and free online tools. These web sites are organized by type and/or function.

LynneW: You will find them featured here as well as in the group room LINKS area

KathleenJ: tell us about some if we have time

LynneW: Tonight we have a guest speaker. Melanie is a 20-something young woman who has created World Wide Nest

LynneW: This is a free site we explored here several months ago.

LynneW: Recently, I was contacted by Melanie's marketing consultant. She had found the TI transcript for WWN and wanted to ask me some questions.

LynneW: As it turns out, Melanie lives in Oregon - although she began WWN while living in France.

KathleenJ: so what is world wide nest -briefly

LynneW: Melanie wanted to create a MySpace alternative that was safe for families.

KathleenJ: great

LynneW: Now, we are working together to explore ways she can expand the site to serve for instruction as well.

CandyMo: yes, but playing catch up on paper work

LynneW: She will be asking you questions and waiting for your questions as well.

KathleenJ: is it just like myspace, but monitored

LynneW: You will have a chance to explore the demo shortly.

KathleenJ: thanks

LynneW: In fact, I'll project the web site and you can do that now. Look for the "Demo Nest" link on the home page. Take a couple of minutes to look at the site and then come back here.

KJackieO: It looks really interesting.

BJB2: anyone have any comments? Questions?

CandyMo: very neat

LynneW: How might WWN be used instructionally?

LynneW: Any ideas?

CandyMo: wow-so many ideas

CandyMo: Language Arts

KathleenJ: links to subjects of interest

CandyMo: History

KJackieO: Tons of ways this site can be use instructionally.

KathleenJ: collaboration

LynneW: And, how might collaboration take place?

KathleenJ: if teachers in different parts of the country want classes to collaborate they could

SusanR: collaboration between two classes

LynneW: Yes!

KJackieO: Students working together to create a glossary of terms they are learning.

KathleenJ: sort of like penpals

LynneW: Guest speakers - an astronaut or the city mayor

AmandaCG: That sounds cool

SusanR . o O (ask an expert)

LynneW: Calendaring - would work great for a soccer team

KJackieO: Shared writing for creating a class story.

AmandaCG: They could compare their education to those in other parts of the country

LynneW: Yes

LynneW: Yes

LynneW: Yes

LynneW: Also, you can create multiple nests

AmandaCG: I bet they would be surprised to hear different views

SusanR: working on a project

CandyMo: so much fun while educational

LynneW: One might be for your own family - another for volunteer activities - another for school

AmandaCG: Cool

AmandaCG: is it free to use?

LynneW: Yes and Melanie is adamant it will stay that way.

KathleenJ: how do they prevent it from becoming myspace

KJackieO: journaling their experiences through a thematic unit

LynneW: There is a lot of integrity to what she is offering.

AmandaCG: Do students need a password

KJackieO: good questions Kathleen

LynneW: Would you like to see a portion of this site created for teachers containing instructional ideas and a method for hooking up with other teachers for collaborative projects?

AmandaCG: yes

KathleenJ: of course

KJackieO: ditto

LynneW: I don't know how long the development time line is but this will happen eventually.

AmandaCG: Is this similar to Tapped In?

LynneW: No, not really.

AmandaCG: how is it different

LynneW: TI has an established community that is well connected and fluid.

LynneW: WWN is more about individuals establishing their own social networks.

KJackieO: Is TI considered a social networking site?

MelanieS joined the room.

AmandaCG: cool so it could be used more for social

LynneW: Welcome Melanie!

SusanR: I like the idea of collaborating and sharing with fellow teachers, Lynne!

MelanieS: Thank you!

BJB2 cheers...welcome back, Melanie!

LynneW: Melanie, we have taken a look at the site.

KathleenJ: great site Melanie

LynneW: Please talk to us about how WWN came to be.

MelanieS: I'm sorry, I've been to the library, 4 coffee shops, and now I'm a the Hood River Hotel

MelanieS: Ok

LynneW: Thank you for putting in so much effort to be with us Melanie.

SusanR: Melanie is determined!

MelanieS: I was living abroad in Paris and I wanted a better way to keep in contact with my family. I didn't feel like any of the other social networking sites had families in their best interest.

MelanieS: So I created World Wide Nest

DavidWe: Cool idea

MelanieS: Thank you!

AmandaCG: oh so it does not have to be for education

MelanieS: Can I please apologize for my late arrival to the forum discussion

LynneW: It wasn't ever thought of as an educational tool.

LynneW: When I looked at it - I immediately saw the possibilities.

AmandaCG: It could be like a virtual teachers lounge

SusanR: Can we take a look at a sample nest, Melanie?

DavidWe . o O (like Tapped in)

MelanieS: No, it can be whatever kind of "family" you would like

MelanieS: Yes

MelanieS: Go to worldwidenest.com and click on the "demo"

KathleenJ: Melanie, how do you keep people from putting up junk?

MelanieS: We monitor each nest ourselves

LynneW: Each nest can only be accessed by invitation of the creator.

KathleenJ: You have your work cut out for you

MelanieS: We close any nest that puts up inappropriate material.

KathleenJ: that is great

AmandaCG nods

MelanieS: Yes we do, but it's important to keep is safe and clean.

LynneW: I think this site is well worthy putting before parents.

KathleenJ: absolutely

LynneW: Often, parents don't know where sites like this exist.

SusanR: so it would be perfect for educators!!

LynneW: That's correct Sue.

KathleenJ: The parent concern would be appeased

MelanieS: We are also working on expanding WWN functions and usage for educators

KathleenJ: That would be terrific

LynneW: Melanie, can you give us a sense of what you are thinking about?

MelanieS: Yes

AmandaCG: I think the nest is cool

MelanieS: We want teachers to use WWN in their classrooms to make communicating easier and more interactive

MelanieS: let me explain.

DavidWe listens

AmandaCG: That is a great idea

AmandaCG: kind of like a blog

MelanieS: You can create a classroom "Nest" and talk with other classrooms all over the word.

MelanieS: World

SusanR: get the principals on board

MelanieS: At the same time you can use it to communicate with your students and their parents. We will also have up to the minute news RSS feed along with weather.

AmandaCG: can it translate into other languages?

MelanieS: Yes

MelanieS: We will translate it into Spanish first.

MelanieS: It has full capabilities to be translated into any language.

LynneW: Can you imagine the possibilities for ELL students?

LynneW: Or any language learner?

MelanieS: Does anyone have any questions about WWN.

LynneW: Melanie, we have some wonderfully talented educators in this session. Do you have any questions for them?

SusanR: Will you be traveling up to Canada to showcase worldwide nest, Melanie?

MelanieS: Yes, these are all things planned for the future.

DavidWe: When did WWN go live on the Web, Melanie?

MelanieS: We are focusing on making WWN the best site it can be for America first.

MelanieS: It went live in October of last year, we are still in some beta testing.

KathleenJ: how do you get funding for this sort of thing

DavidWe . o O (good question, Kathleen)

AmandaCG nods

MelanieS: Well, it was hard at first. No one wants to listen to a kid with a crazy idea.

SusanR . o O (no advertising)

KathleenJ: So much work-if it gets bigger, that's a lot to do

MelanieS: But I was determined, and eventually I got some independent investors.

KJackieO: Melanie, what kind of computer background do you have?

MelanieS: I only have the basic knowledge.

KJackieO: excellent work

MelanieS: I guess I'm an idea person

MelanieS: I am really passionate about this project and it was easy to find people with the same goals, like Lynne!

KathleenJ: so , do people volunteer to help with some of the work

MelanieS: Yes, a lot of friends and family members have volunteered a lot of time to this project.

LynneW: It is important that each of you know you can start using WWN immediately.

MelanieS: For example, my best friend Jill gave up a career in N.Y.C to help me.

KJackieO: I plan to.

KathleenJ: did you just start with a web site?

KathleenJ: you have great friends

KathleenJ: makes a project like this more important

MelanieS: I don't quite understand what you're asking Kathleen.

MelanieS: about the web site

SusanR: So are all nests private, Melanie?

MelanieS: Yes.

KathleenJ: Yes-don't worry, me being silly it doesn't make sense

MelanieS: oh

LynneW: Participation in any nest is by invitation only. Invites are issued by the nest creator

KathleenJ: I was just thinking that one of the things that students need now is good social networking and friends

LynneW: We wanted to have a nest we could play in but the site is so secure - we couldn't make it available to you without going through individual enrollment processes.

MelanieS: Yes, Lynne, this is true. But anyone can create a nest of their own without an invitation.

MelanieS: Once you have created a "Nest", there is a tab on your profile page that says "invite to join"

LynneW: Right - I should have said "any established nest"

KJackieO: I like the look and feel. Not cluttered and easy to navigate

MelanieS: Thanks, we wanted to keep it simple and easy to use.

AmandaCG: It is kind of like my space but censored

KathleenJ: it does make a difference in their learning, so this is great to use for collaboration. Children would know they [have]a friend somewhere. I'm just going on about children needing friends and how it helps them learn

MelanieS: It should be easy to use no matter what your computer experience is.

JeffC wonders if you're talking about zaadz?

LynneW: Melanie talk about how the site handles images.

DavidWe . o O (zaadz?)

MelanieS: You can upload photos to your personal page or family page.

DavidWe: Hey, Jeff, Melanie is upriver from you

AmandaCG: Do you have other people help you monitor

JeffC: http://www.zaadz.com/

SusanR: I have a niece in Chile..may try to use it to bring our family together, Melanie

MelanieS: Yes, we have a team of people that help keep the site safe.

JeffC: <u>http://www.worldwidenest.com/</u> is also a good myspace alternative.

LynneW: Jeff, Melanie is President of Worldwide Nest

JeffC: oh... ok... then I hit on the right one!

MelanieS: It can be difficult at times.

AmandaCG: yes it is something new

MelanieS: In regards to images, we plan to have slide show functions and multiple uploads available soon. We will also have video conferencing.

KJackieO: great

LynneW: I want to point out how WWN is different that TI's K-12 student campus.

LynneW: TI has a different set of tools available.

BJB2: slide shows and video conferencing options are good

LynneW: Also, TI is in real time while WWN is asynchronous.

LynneW: Yes TI can be asych as well.

DavidWe . o O (not if it will do video-conferencing, I'm guessing)

LynneW: Video conferencing can be a powerful feature.

DavidWe smiles

DavidWe looks at the clock on the wall

SusanR: In the FAQs it says "Nests can be made private and/or public."

LynneW: Melanie, do you have any time frame estimate when these features might be made available? one year - two???

MelanieS: Thats true, it can bring people from across the world together.

DavidWe . o O (like Tapped In)

MelanieS: We are planning them for 2008, but it may be sooner.

LynneW: We are near the end of our time here today. Any last questions or comments?

AmandaCG: what is asynchronous

DavidWe: not in real time

BJB2: before it gets too late, a reminder that the next Web 2.0 discussion will take place on April 19

DavidWe: like email, Amanda

KathleenJ: sorry-I've got to go. But thank you so much-It's a great site and it's nice of you to talk to us

LynneW: Our next session will be another guest speaker - Bill Fitzgerald of Funny Monkey

DavidWe: Thanks for struggling to get logged in, Melanie

BJB2: thank you, Lynne and Melanie, for sharing this site with us
