MichaelM: Welcome to tonight's "A K12 Teacher Wiki" group discussion.

MichaelM: Tapped In is a professional education industry forum that enables our group to

MichaelM: discuss new ideas, recruit members, and chat about how to utilize

MichaelM: this teacher wiki to provide resources and promote education and communication

MichaelM: During this tour I'll be taking you on a virtual field trip of the of HelpingStudents.org free teacher wikis

MichaelM: Hi David

DavidW: Hi

ShervlM joined the room.

MichaelM: Welcome back Sheryl!

MichaelM: My objective for this tour is to help you feel more comfortable navigating teacher wikis.

SherylM: thanks

SherylM: super

MichaelM: A transcript will be emailed to all of you, so don't try to visit all the links unless we are demonstrating a page or concept.

MichaelM: There are too many features available to discuss them all. Once you have your own login, you can practice editing,

MichaelM: Please stop me if you have a question at any point during the discussion.

MichaelM: In the following days after the discussion we encouraged everyone to email accounts@helpingstudents.org

MichaelM: or call 757-513-8989 to help you get started editing Wiki (Quick):)

MichaelM: I'm working from a dial up connection this evening. If I'm temporarily disconnected, please stay put and I'll be back in a wiki flash.

MichaelM: Each member of Tapped In and teacher wikis are valued member of the community and has something to contribute...

MichaelM: One of our strengths is also our weakness. Since this wiki and supporting processes is designed for schools and teachers, we must verify member teaching status. We do not allow anyone on the Internet to create an account like most other wikis. Only teachers or education industry professionals may receive a membership. This provides a safe wiki, but also inhibits members. Most people using the Web 2.0

MichaelM: or wikis expect instant gratification. We are a nonprofit supporting technology for schools, teachers and their students.

MichaelM: What is a wiki? Can anyone help me?

TeresaR: Collaboration on the fly?

MichaelM: That's right. That is probably one of the reason's schools are slow to adapt

SusanR: A wiki is a collaborative website which can be directly edited by anyone with access to it.

MichaelM: Planning and processes for school compliance should be considered

MichaelM: Wiki is a Hawaiian term meaning "fast". The first such software to be called a wiki, WikiWikiWeb, was named by Ward Cunningham in 1995. There are many Wikis. The most widely known wiki is Wikipedia: which is a free on online encyclopedia that a group of people may edit. An increasing number of Fortune 500 companies are using wikis group collaboration.

MichaelM: The "Gartner Group, a research firm in Stamford, Conn., predicts that by 2009, wikis will be installed on half of all corporate networks." – Dahl

MichaelM: Inc. Magazine published an article written by Darren Dahl in the February 2006 issue. The cover was titled "E-mail Overload? Time To Get A Wiki" and the article described inherent problems of using email and benefits of Wikis.

MichaelM: "Which document is the current version? Who has made changes? Who still needs to weigh in? For managers, keeping track of it all had become a time consuming nightmare." - Dahl

MichaelM: No. You simply attach an image file to your wiki page. Then you can insert it

TeresaR: Can you determine where it is placed?

MichaelM: We recommend you put images on a separate page and refer to it

MichaelM: Yes.

MichaelM: Let me find an example for you

MichaelM: You can all login with Teacher1 as a username. The password for everyone

is mypass

MichaelM: I will put a picture in the Sandbox page in just a second so you can see

MichaelM: Yes. The plain text editor is nice if you want to copy alot of data fast (Wiki :) from another page.

MichaelM: Watch how fast I can add every college in the country.

TeresaR: How are comments different from edit page?

MichaelM: Done

TeresaR: As the kids would say, "Sweet"

MichaelM: Not much different. Just a comment. This may be where you would justify or comment about why you changed the page

TeresaR: Can you create a link so it opens in a new tab instead of the same window?

TeresaR: Example clicking A opens the page in the parent window rather than a new window.

MichaelM: This is a very powerful concept that demonstrates power of collaboration using JSPWiki

BeverleyC: I am interested in why teachers would set up a Wiki to use with their students as, say, part of an English assignment.

MichaelM: Perhaps that would not be a wiki group project

SherylM: I think any class could use the wiki white board

DavidW: group writing project

DavidW: teams of students composing a document

SherylM: To organize, brainstorm, answer teacher questions

MichaelM: Students can also use the wiki to organize their own notes and only allow

their teacher access.

SherylM . o O (oh yes)

TeresaR: Reference links

SherylM nods

MichaelM: Each page can be set up as a group or personal page by the teacher

MichaelM: Teachers may also restore a wiki page to any previous version

MichaelM: This is great for the beginning of a school year.

documentation of who did the changing if it isn't accidental.

MichaelM: And with this wiki, you can copy all your content to a school server

SherylM: Yes, which version of JSPwiki should we download...did you already say that?

if so, sorry.

MichaelM: This enables true ownership of your wiki with easy integration

MichaelM: We are using JSPWiki v2.4.56

MichaelM: There are later versions

BeverleyC: Thanks for your help with the writing example.

MichaelM: Downloading is optional.

SherylM: OK

MichaelM: This wiki can serve as a school testing site also

MichaelM: Does anyone have questions about editing?

BjB looks at the clock on the wall
