PamB: it's like IM but on steroids.

MarciaBe: I loved it! It was my first.

MarciaBe: Ah, I did see that and just found the web page at twitter.com. How do you think you might use it?

PamB: you select friends and send tweets to them, all day,, whatever comes to mind,, what you are doing, reading, eating, locating, etc.

MarciaBe: What do you do in K-12, Pam?

PamB: the marketing consultant was saying it could be used to build relationships with clients.

PamB: I'm a national consultant for school and public libraries

MarciaBe: There are very few marketing consultants that I would want IMing me throughout the day

PamB: high communication geeks love Twitter

MarciaBe: I bet you see some cool things and are able to share a lot of information all over the nation.

BonnieHa joined the room.

PamB: yes. I really love what I do!

PamB: hi Bonnie

BonnieHa: Hello there.

PamB: I was going to introduce a tool called Voicethreads tonight. Are you familiar with

it?

MarciaBe: Not yet

BonnieHa: No

PamB: I just came across it recently and I think it has great potential for language arts.

MarciaBe: Do you have a link for it?

PamB: A VoiceThread is an online media album that allows people to make comments, either audio or text, and share them with anyone they wish. A VoiceThread allows an entire group's story to be told and collected in one place.

PamB: it's very easy and free. You use photos or other images, upload them, and use your computer's microphone to add narration or other audio, or, if you don't have, or don't want to use a sound recording, you can simply type copy. Then people can comment, by voice or text, on your VoiceThreads, or you can limit who comments and who sees/hears the comment when.

MarciaBe: Can you password protect the site?

PamB: Do you want to take a look at it?

MarciaBe: Yes

PamB: yes, it has different levels of security

BonnieHa: sure

MarciaBe: This could be fun for families, too.

PamB: Let's look at two items on the Voicethread website and then return here.

PamB: 1. Go to the website and click on "What's a Voice Thread Anyway?

PamB: 2. Go to the bottom of the screen and click on Classroom

PamB: http://voicethread.com

PamB: is everyone okay?

BonnieHa: I'm checking out the site...a-ok here.

MarciaBe: I didn't see Classroom but what I have seen is great.

PamB: Try looking at this voicethread http://voicethread.com/view.php?b=3352

PamB: or this one for very young students:

MarciaBe: I teach several online classes as well as face-to-face. I can see some applications with this. Thanks.

PamB: so did I

BonnieHa: This is cool!

PamB: I showed it to a group of students who were evaluating tools and they reported:

PamB: The positive features of this site are:

PamB: that's it's free, supports auditory learning, it's child friendly, stimulating...etc.

MarciaBe: Have you played with it all? Responded to anyone?

PamB: you can also put a voicethread on a blog.

MarciaBe: Would you do that with a link?

PamB: no, not yet. I hope to have time this week to play with it.

PamB: Not exactly, You need to use code...

MarciaBe: I know I won't get to it until next week. I'd love to see your playing.....

PamB: I saw it explained with Edublogs. I'll find the link...

BJB2: Marcia, that is where joining this group would be beneficial...

BJB2: Joining a group subscribes you to the discussion board...

PamB: Here it is..I found it!
