MichaelM: What is a Wiki?

MichaelM: Wiki is a Hawaiian term meaning "fast". The first such software to be called a wiki, WikiWikiWeb, was named by Ward Cunningham In 1995. There are many Wikis. The most widely known wiki is Wikipedia: which is a free on online encyclopedia that a group of people may edit. An increasing number of Fortune 500 companies are using wikis group collaboration.

MichaelM: The "Gartner Group, a research firm in Stamford, Conn., predicts that by 2009, wikis will be installed on half of all corporate networks." – Dahl

SusanR: A wiki is a website or similar online resource which allows users to add and edit content collectively

MichaelM: This wiki allows each of your pages to have view, edit and attachments.

MichaelM: That is, separate permissions depending on the nature of your wiki page

MichaelM: You can also create multiple left menus (depending on page content or needs)

MichaelM: Has anyone tried to edit or add a page?

TeresaS: No, I haven't - I don't want to break anything;)

MichaelM: Please try it and I'll wait.

MichaelM: All pages can be restored to any previous version.

MichaelM: Please Don't Worry about breaking anything

TeresaS: Oooo, html. *shiver*

MichaelM: No html

MichaelM: Just click Edit page, type something and scroll down and click the save

button

MichaelM: This wiki does not use or allow HTML

TeresaS: Michael - what would you say is the main purpose of this wiki?

MichaelM: Parent, teacher, student collaboration

JanetJG: how would parents use a wiki?

MichaelM: This wiki is a nonprofit exclusive for education and is mostly organized by states

MichaelM: If teachers give their student a login, the students are able to add pages for their community

TeresaS: So, is it designed specifically as a site to organize other educator wikis? Or for other educators to communicate?

MichaelM: For example High school football results

MichaelM: Each wiki may be protected among a group so it may serve both purposes.

DavidW: Are people doing that, Michael?

MichaelM: For example this is a college info page for parents
