PatriciaCh: the students really get a kick out of this ...because paper airplanes are frowned on

**JeffC**: lots avariables regarding flying... of course there are different models... I'm looking at the Airplane webquest now (ok... I didn't start in the middle... more towards the end)

PatriciaCh: I like to stick to the simple triangular ones ...but there are tons of different types ...

JeffC: not to mention putting paper clips on the front, etc.

**PatriciaCh**: with the older students ...they can pick one ..you can have contests ... do percentages

**SusanR**: Will you excuse me, I have to step out for awhile and pick up a prescription for my sore throat before the pharmacy closes

SusanR: regrets of course

**PatriciaCh**: also ...with the triangular ones ...if you fold the nose with a perfect point ... and aim it correctly ...it will stick on certain ceilings

PatriciaCh: Susan - feel better

SusanR: thank you ..

**SusanR**: hope to be back later

SadyGst4 joined the room.

PatriciaCh: hello ..welcome

**BjB**: Hi, Sady

**BjB**: glad you could join the discussion.

SadyGst4: hi

BjB: we're having fun talking about paper airplanes

PatriciaCh: we were discussing ...using paper airplanes to teach symmetry and measurements

BjB: your little ones would love that too, I'll bet, Sady

PatriciaCh: I teach middle school ... paper airplanes are a hit with them

**SadyGst4**: Yes, I'm sure my kids would like it if we took the time to make them one day and look at the lines the folds make

PatriciaCh: I scaffold the lesson according to the students ability

SadyGst4: we could also experiment with different size paper and see how far they go

PatriciaCh: you can also look at the different triangles as well

**PatriciaCh**: Sady ...that is perfect

SadyGst4: good idea

PatriciaCh: As Jeff pointed out ...there are different types ...some of more complex

JeffC: look at the Featured links Sady

**PatriciaCh**: you can ask the students to look at the different types ...make a prediction ...which one will fly the furthest (sp?)

**JeffC**: I'll put them into chat for the transcript (if you click links in chat, Sady, be sure to hold down the Ctrl key or else your popup blocker will log you out):

**JeffC**: that's the first... and yup... paper clips are a must for top flight airplanes... I'm wondering how you could get a uniform throw though!

SadyGst4: I am going to look at the webquest one

**JeffC**: you need to accept popups from Tapped In or hold the Ctrl key down when clicking in chat...

PatriciaCh: you can do so much with this concept

JeffC: but you should be safe just clicking the Featured links in the top frame.

SadyGst4: I did... and it worked, but then it cleared the chat

JeffC: <u>http://www.10paperairplanes.com/</u>

SadyGst4: that's what I will do

**JeffC**: this one is the airplane webquest: http://oak.cats.ohiou.edu/~cb338090/Web%20Quest/lesson.htm **JeffC**: and the last one is a .pdf lesson plan: http://www.nationalmuseum.af.mil/shared/media/document/AFD-090710-032.pdf

**BjB**: you can come back to this room later to look at the featured links that Pat has provided, Sady

JeffC: all these are from Patricia... I'm going to make shorter versions of the above.

**SadyGst4**: I am going to have to go now, but I plan to come back as a guest another day to do some more exploring. This has been a cool experience

PatriciaCh: You will be a big hit with your students

SadyGst4: thanks again

**PatriciaCh**: it is always fun to try to teach math a different way ... the students will remember the concepts better

**BjB** agrees

PatriciaCh: I wish my math classes were like this

**BjB**: maybe you could try to have them online?

**BjB**: this is from the current edchat discussion: the problem is when students have been 'spoonfed' for years - then you want them to make choices, be self directed - very hard

**JeffC**: I created <u>http://snurl.com/airplane1</u> <u>http://snurl.com/airplane3</u> up to <u>http://snurl.com/airplane6</u> ... <u>http://snurl.com/airplane2</u> was already taken... for the movie sequel... but anyways all of the above links now have shortcuts.

**BjB**: thanks, Jeff

PatriciaCh: thanks ...

PatriciaCh: yes it is ... the poor kiddies cannot think ..and it gets worse when they get to college

SusanR: I am back

**BjB** nods to Pat

PatriciaCh: we have a virtual school ... but is a lot more work

SusanR: and reviewing the transcript

SusanR: and listening

**PatriciaCh**: as you said ....most are not self-directed ...so online teachers has to call home constantly

**PatriciaCh**: There is no real answer...:(

BjB: where do you think intervention should start? Kindergarten? 3rd grade?

PatriciaCh: When homework is assigned ...

**PatriciaCh**: parents tell the kids to say ...I don't get it ... when they don't have time to finish work ...

PatriciaCh: because they were at soccer practice or whatever

**PatriciaCh**: the best is .... when a child is absent ...parents assume the child doesn't have to make up the work

**BjB**: yikes! That doesn't benefit the teacher or the kid

**BjB**: does your school have a web page?

PatriciaCh: I know ...but if the child is conditioned to do this ...

BjB: each teacher should have their own webpage linked from the school's page...

**BjB**: and the parents should be aware that assignments, etc. will be posted

**PatriciaCh**: yes .. my homework is posted on my page ,...the online grade book ...as well as a hard copy in the classroom .... this is 8th grade ... the usual excuse ...the teacher didn't tell me

SusanR: 8th grade ...soo challenging in many ways

**BjB**: 8th grade!?

PatriciaCh: yes

**PatriciaCh**: the sad part is ...many of my colleagues do not collect homework .... they make it a completion grade

SusanR: Can I see you class web page please?

**PatriciaCh**: they walk up and down aisles ... and note down if a student do not have the homework

PatriciaCh: click on staff ...go down to the 8th grade ..Pat Chen
