LesleyF: Hi, Kathy!

KathyBu : Hi!

KathyBu : Just got here.

LesleyF: Ready to talk about motivation and technology?

LesleyF: Right now it's sort of chummy ...

KathyBu : Yes! It's also Back to School Night so I'm a little fragmented.

**LesleyF**: deep breathing before the masses arrive?

**KathyBu** : One of the things I want suggestions on is helping those scared of technology to use it more.

KathyBu : yes. Meditation.

LesleyF: Is that for teachers more than for students?

KathyBu : Yes. I'm a site leader here.

LesleyF: Let's go ahead with that idea, then, as a way to start the conversation.

KathyBu : I help people to start using it by using it with them.

**LesleyF**: Basically, the technology has to align with what the teacher wants to do (or has to do), and it has to make their life either simpler or "funner."

KathyBu : But it's so enriching that I want to help them use it!

**LesleyF**: Sometimes you have to go with the personal needs/interests too... sending pix to grandkids, finding genealogy, selling on ebay...

**KathyBu** : They think it's not simple and the fun is for the students. Good ideas on grandkids etc.

**LesleyF**: So thinking teachery, have you shown them some good sites -- say, one site a month during a faculty meeting.

**KathyBu** : My computer capability at work is just beginning to get up to where I can do that. Good idea!

LesleyF: You can even start by printing out the splash screen page...

**LesleyF**: Do you know about discovery school?

**KathyBu** : We now will have 109 computers, still not connected, but here. Yes, I've used it.

LesleyF: So have you shared that with them?

LesleyF: How about FunBrain or SCORE?

KathyBu : No, Only in addresses.

KathyBu : We just bought 2 LCD projectors so I'm raring to go.

LesleyF: Some teachers are very concrete learners -- they really have to see it in action.

A URL is not enough. TG for LCD...

**SusanpcGst2** joined the room.

JaneR joined the room.

LesleyF: Have you shown them Pam Berger's CyberTours?

BJ: Hi, Susan and Jane

LesleyF: Hi, folks! We're talking about motivation and technology.

KathyBu : I'm not sure I know the Cybertours one.

**LesleyF**: So, now that you've had a look, how do you think this site could motivate teachers and students?

**KathyBu** : Wow! I quickly went over the Reference and the Web search cybertours. The Websearch one I could use with my GATE students to start.

**LesleyF**: The active learning sites are really fun too.

**KathyBu** : I had looked at some Think quests before, but these would help me teach what I'm presently trying to have students learn.

JaneR: The "Search Strategy" section looks pretty good. Nice basic info that middle Schoolers could handle.

**LesleyF**: Your point about ThinkQuests and WebQuests also reminds us that those are good motivating tools.

**LesleyF**: I should note that teachers and students can both produce them -- but they should try them out as "consumers" first (students actually have more fun making them than teachers, I think.)

**LesleyF**: There's a very good site that talks about student motivation and technology, which I think fits for teachers as well -- and is useful for teachers to see when they're thinking about incorporating technology. Want to see it?

SusanpcGst2: I found the build your own website section interesting.

KathyBu : Yes, please.

JaneR: Yes, may we see the site?

LesleyF: OK. It's

LesleyF: So can you think of some ways to apply these recommendations?

**LesleyF**: Good idea, Jane. That way they can see for themselves rather than you telling them...

**SusanpcGst2**: I find the cable TV educational programs very motivational. PBS, <u>www.pbs.org/wgbh</u>

**JaneR**: Right. It should help them think out a plan before they try a lab project. **KathyBu** : We have a separate computer lab at our K-6 school, but I will be getting 6 computers for research in the school library.

**LesleyF**: Absolutely -- let's all take a look for a minute or two. I must tell you that teens now prefer the Internet to TV...

KathyBu : So do I!

**KathyBu** : When I poll students, the biggest use of the Internet is to download music or watch music videos.

**LesleyF**: So I'm hearing that the issue of motivation isn't really with the students, it's the teachers?

LesleyF: Access to information ... which yearns to be free?

**KathyBu** : That's my experience. Kids, especially those with learning issues gravitate to computers. Now they don't always want to do what you want them to do.

**JaneR**: It takes good planning to use technology to teach kids. I think teachers want to use it, but the learning curve and time needed is great.

**KathyBu** : Our site is investing in Orchard software which aligns to the California standards. It's a good way to start making it easy for teachers to use technology.

**SusanpcGst2**: Discovery Channel's: <u>http://school.discovery.com/ontv/ad.html</u> **JaneR**: Aligning to standards is a step in the right direction.

LesleyF: Do you know about CLRN: Cal. Learning Resource Network? It has reviews of software and video aligned with state standards

**LesleyF**: You can even start with the standards, by grade and by subject, and get a list of the best reviewed resources. Want to see?

**KathyBu** : The computer assesses student knowledge in standard areas through a pre-test and prints out a report which teachers can use to discuss student progress with parents. **SusanpcGst2**: AETV: http://www.aetv.com/class/teach/

**KathyBu** : I'm very familiar with CLRN and used it to make software recommendations at my school.

LesleyF: For the others, it's <u>http://www.clrn.org.</u> It also includes lessons.
