CharlesM: At the elem. level the last big initiative was called Challenge 200 (ending in that year)...

CharlesM: I was a secondary Tech learning Coord, but got to work on a team that included elem. teachers

SusanR: What was tech integration like at the elementary level?

CharlesM: We got quite a good start on curricular integration in the mid 90s, then funding dried up @ 1998

SusanR: Our staff development and training money has dried up.

CharlesM: It was lead by some very creative people that were able to combine content and multimedia/ exchange projects etc.

CharlesM: (us too, at both sec and elem)

CharlesM: The project we were running was to look at student performance when augmented by tech integration (specifically multimedia) and alternative assessment methodology.

CharlesM: SRI did the measurement and produced a report showing a corollary between achievement and tech integration. But Stanford was very unimpressed and continues to say that there is no connection.
