BJB2: since we have such a lovely large group, let's take the cue from Pam on how the discussion will go.

BJB2 . o O (because I know Pam has a lot of great stuff to share!)

PamB: We are going to talk about the Top Web 2.0 Tools for 2007...or least what we think are some of the best...maybe 5 to 10 tools.

BJB2 . o O (Tapped In is number one of course ;-))

PamB: I had a hard time narrowing the list to 5!

PamB: Tapped In is the always number 1 ---

SusanR . o O (anxious to compare my list with Pam's)

PamB: Let's start my throwing out what you think is your favorite Web 2.0 tool...

PamB: but first....

PamB: consider the criteria...

PamB: it has to be a real web 2.0 tool...

PamB: collaborative, social, interactive...

PamB: support collaborative content development or perhaps communication, etc.

PamB: My first choice at the moment is a social bookmarking tool called Diigo.com

PatriciaCS: Google docs, communicate with each other.

TrinieL: I'm Trinie Laplander, and I teach 6th grade language arts in Trevor, WI Tapio... Lapland you say?

BillW: Google docs is a wonderful tool

SusanR: Twitter

TapioH: Finnish Lapland, Rovaniemi

PamB: diigo is similar to delicious but has sticky notes and annotations and highlighting.

BJB2: when Pam or anyone shares a url, hold down the ctrl key on your keyboard when you click on the url

PamB: the url is http://www.diigo.com

PatriciaCS: This could be useful. maybe we should do this when we do our homework?

PamB: I see twitter, google docs...others?

PatriciaCS: Does spelling count?

PamB: no!

PatriciaCS: Good!

BJB2: Sue shared some great sites during her K-3 Resources discussion yesterday

PamB: Let's take a look at diigo for 5 minutes and then come back and talk about it.

LouisL: sadly our school filter blocks diigo

KrisWe: Diigo looks like a combo of many of the things that Google offers. What can we do with Diigo that may go beyond what Google offers?

SusanR: Diigo is still holding my bookmarks from 2006

PamB: diigo is a bookmarking site where as google is a search engine and other parts of google offer a home page, docs, etc....

PamB: I don't think google offers bookmarking.

JeffC: yes... google toolbar now has a bookmarking feature.

PamB: It's something like favorites on IE but it's web based and has tagging.

PamB: Jeff, does it use tagging and the other features of diigo. I haven't use the google bookmark feature.

JeffC: I don't use it, just know it exists... but I'd recommend diigo or other social bookmark sites over google's.

BJB2: why, Jeff?

JeffC: well... for the simple reason that it's easier to collaborate using diigo or others... especially if you want to tag and collaborate.

PamB: http://del.icio.us is one of the most popular social bookmarking but it doesn't have all the features of diigo.com

SusanR: I have my network of delicious users that I follow so I am reluctant to change

BillW: Sounds very interesting, I will look into it more from another site. I am currently blocked

SusanR agrees about Diigo..it is feature rich

PamB: Another one of my top picks is Ning.com

PamB: have you used it? what do you think?

TomMu: I have heard of ning

BJB2: I've used a few of the ning sites...for art teachers and for librarians. They have a lot to offer

SusanR: I just joined the Technospud Ning

PamB: Let's take a look at this ning http://classroom20.ning.com/

PamB: come back in 5 minutes. okay?

PamB: There is also a school librarian's Ning at http://teacherlibrarian.ning.com/

LouisL: I did get into http://www.classroom20.com/

BJB2: is the librarians ning Joyce's?

PamB: yes

BJB2: can anyone create a ning, Pam?

PamB: both nings have rich content and conversations.

PamB: yes, it's free.

PamB: and members have all rights...

BJB2: is there real time text chat? voice? video?

PamB: to create sub groups, webpages within the ning, etc.

PamB: you can post videos and podcasts but I don't think there is live chat...

PamB: Jeff. do you know?

PamB: I have never done that on a ning.

JeffC: they're working on it

JeffC: no live chats on ning at the moment

SusanR: Thanks ..easy to create and set up

PamB: Jeff, are you in classroom 2.0

JeffC: yes... but I don't "hang out" there much.

PamB: any other comments on the nings? how do you see teachers using it with students?

PamB: How about a class ning?

KrisWe: With ning, could a student edit another students' work?

PamB: I think a better tool to use to edit each other's work would be Google docs or Wikispaces.

PamB: Are you familiar with these tools?

KrisWe: actually, we are seeking a tool where students cannot edit others' work

LouisL: and http://www.pbwiki.com

JeffC: I'd also recommend http://www.thinkfree.com if you're looking to do collaborative documents (it's a free MS Office emulator).

KrisWe: Yes, I have a Pb Wiki page for my classroom and I use Google Docs often for class prep because it's blocked at our school.

PamB: you can sign up for a free wiki without advertising at http://educationalwikis.wikispaces.com/

JeffC: Have you tried to convince your IT people to unblock google docs, Kris?

BJB2: how are you doing on your list, Pam? 20 minutes left

PamB: Jeff, I just went to thinkfree and it said the premium service will expire for all users in June 2008, what's the premium service?

PamB: Okay back on track...

PamB: the next tool I picked was Voicethread!

JeffC: well... I know they're shifting around... but don't know about their Premium.

SusanR: http://jottit.com/ is simplistic but cool

PamB: one of my real favorites! take a look at it http://www.voicethread.com

PamB: jottit looks interesting

PamB: rather than powerpoint have kids use voicethread.

PamB: they have some good examples for elementary through HS

BJB2: voicethread was demoed during another TI discussion...it's pretty awesome

SusanR: I have been playing with Voicethread..quite easy to use

PamB: I agree. It was used a lot in the K12 Online Conference

LouisL: I love voicethread

PamB: I like the interaction of it.

LouisL: very powerful

PamB: Louis, how have you used it?

LouisL: I have used it - mostly in demonstration - but I have also done items like my

family picnic
