ElizabethC: How easy is it to edit?

BJB2: pretty easy. There is an editing wizard

DanaMB: Can you see what goes on the wiki before it is added to it?

DanaMB: For example

BJB2: under featured items is a link to Practice editing in Sandbox

DanaMB: a student can send me part of a story for kids to edit

DanaMB: and you can watch comments before they go on the wiki?

BJB2: that I'm not sure about, Dana

ElizabethC: Are there ads on the site?

BJB2: no ads

DanaMB: That will help get this approved at my school.

ElizabethC: That's good. I've seen some where I just didn't want my kids to be there.

BJB2: and you can restore pages if someone changed something you don't want

StefanieS: I am going to learn more about wikis before I join this chat, ladies.

JeffC joined the room.

BJB2: Jeff, do you remember if teachers can check posts before they are entered?

JeffC: my biggest question is for Michael... what happens when two or more are editing simultaneously? this is particularly likely to happen if you bring a class into a computer lab to work on a project.

ElizabethC: Good question.

JeffC: I think most wiki sites allow anonymous editing if the wiki creator wants it... or login required (obviously best for schools).

ElizabethC: So the trick is to be careful how you set it up?

JeffC: well... like anything... yeah.

BJB2: and be sure that you have a purpose for the wiki

ElizabethC: We're going to do one on global warming.

BJB2: a hot topic!

BJB2 . o O (pun intended)

DanaMB: I was hoping to set up a wiki for my after school writing club.

ElizabethC smiles

DanaMB: Let students talk about characters, plots etc.

DanaMB: then others could ask questions or make comments on the writing

DanaMB: Would it be better to use another tool?

ElizabethC: That sounds more like a blog or a discussion board, I think.

ElizabethC: A wiki would be better if you wanted the students to each write an "article" about a character, for example.

ElizabethC: At least, that's how I understand wikis.

DanaMB: what if they would work on a collaborative story?

BJB2: the students can edit an article written by another student in a wiki

BJB2: they can only comment on the article in a blog

ElizabethC: Yes, I think that would work. I was also thinking of Google docs for a collaborative work like that.

DanaMB: maybe the wiki can then be used for putting the newspaper

ElizabethC: I think that is the kind of project that's perfect for a newspaper.
