**LynneW**: A tool like this helps break it down and keep it "on the front burner" to help students focus on what they need to work towards to reach the due date.

**LynneW**: They can post their other time obligations (lessons, sports, etc.) and the planner finds the "space" for recommended times to work on homework.

**LynneW**: What do you think?

FeliciaC: this is a good tool for those students who have organization issues

**FeliciaC**: it's good for all students

**LynneW**: It can certainly help students learn to be better organizers of their time.

**ElizabethC**: It's good for those with lots of obligations, such as people on sports teams.

**LynneW**: Also good for parents to see if their kids are being over scheduled.

**LynneW**: Are you ready to review another resource site?

KarenCod: yes

**LynneW**: There are several different course management systems out there. Moodle is the most frequently used open source CMS.

**LynneW**: The sites have a sole purpose -- not multiple purposes.

LynneW: They are truly TOOLS. You use it when you need it and only when you need

it.

**JennyEB**: BUT couldn't they be interconnected by the user?

**LynneW**: That is called a MASHUP.

**LynneW**: Combining services to accomplish something neither of them do alone.

**ElizabethC**: I've often wondered about that term.

JennyEB: ditto

**LynneW**: Do you have a better sense of Web 2.0 and how you can use it?

**LynneW**: Interact with it?

JennyEB: indeed

**LynneW**: Create and communicate with it?

Elizabe thC: yes

FeliciaC: yes

**LynneW**: All web-based.

**LynneW**: No need to buy special software or have particular hardware.
