BJB2: it automatically adds this group to the drop down favorite places menu in the top right of the web window next to the Go! button...

LynneW: I have tried it and believe it would be a wonderful tool for collaborative online projects.

LynneW: I invited Inspiration to send us a guest speaker and they declined. They have created this tool to market to businesses.

LynneW: The beta is free to try.

SaraDay: I don't know what Beta means.

JeffC: they're still testing it, Sara.

SaraDav: Thanks,

KellyCM: how do we try it?

SusanR . o O (not quite ready for prime time)

LynneW: The link is on the desktop. You may also find it here. http://www.myWebspiration.com

KellyCM: Thanks

LynneW: If you want to take the opportunity to sign-up and try it. I'll give you several minutes.

LynneW: You invite others to participate with a collaboration, by e-mail.

LynneW: You can use my email cupdxprof@gmail.com any time you want to test out the collaborative aspect of this software.

LynneW: I used it recently at a non-profit and it was great.

LynneW: Go check it out and let me know when you have returned.

SaraDav: Will all participants have to have the software or just the invitee?

LynneW: The software is web hosted. You don't need software. Just Internet access and a browser.

LynneW: Project files are saved on their server.

LynneW: At least at this point in time.

JeffC: ok Lynne... invited you.

LynneW: BRB

LynneW left the room (signed off).

SaraDav: I see. Thanks. My school use to have Kidspiration.

JeffC: I've started a collaborative one... once you sign up... tell me your user name at Webspiration and I'll invite anyone who wants to try.

SusanR: sroseman

MarleneK: MarleneK

SaraDav: sdavid

JeffC: done

LynneW joined the room.

LynneW: Sorry folks. I got bounced out.

LynneW: Jeff, there is a permission setting you need to change to give me access. Since I'm an existing member you probably have to invite me to collaborate using my user name **LynneW**.

JeffC: ok

JeffC: I'll invite you Lynne... then I'm out the door... gotta pick up my son.

LynneW: Who is back here with me now?

LynneW: OK Jeff

SusanR: still here

LynneW joined the room.

LynneW joined the room.

LynneW: How about if we explore another resource. I'll be happy to collaborate with you as a test, at another time.

KellyCM: ok

SusanR: np

MarleneK: I like the selections of templates on Webspiration... especially the idea map.

LynneW: Dabbleboard is an online whiteboard reinvented. Kelly, one of the rules for this group is the tools shared must be FREE. All are web applications.

KellyCM: ok

LynneW: Dabbleboard is one of those. http://dabbleboard.com

LynneW: Go check it out and let me know when you return here.

SaraDav: Sorry! Just got back from webspiration.

LynneW: No problem.

LynneW: Do you see the link for Dabbleboard?

SaraDav: On my way to check it out.

LynneW: Let me know when you return.

SaraDav: I have an ActivBoard in my classroom. It's very similar.

LynneW: How much do you use it Sara?

KellyCM: I am in a school with a staff of 90 teachers with 3 SmartBoards; this is a great

alternative

SaraDav: All day everyday.

LynneW: Wonderful!

SusanR: cool ..allows you to use tokbox for video and audio

MarleneK: This is sweet.. so you can draw anything you like.. and then email it to

yourself or anyone else.. and add text:)

LynneW: What are some ways you might use this tool?

LynneW: Instructionally

KellyCM: Brainstorming as a class

LynneW: Good

LynneW: What else?

SusanR: label a pic; or adding notes

LynneW: Yes

SusanR: to photos taken

LynneW: Good

LynneW: More?

SaraDav: It's great with math!

SaraDav: Geometry

KellyCM: Graphic organizers

LynneW: How about writing an image to explain a process?

MarleneK: Practicing clear communications skills by having kids give each other instructions to draw things.. then get them to email the answers to the teacher

LynneW: Oh, very good!

KellyCM: Collaboration with another class

LynneW: Can you each see how Web 2.0 tools are driving down the cost of ed tech substantially?

SaraDav: do tell

KellyCM: Yes; and thank goodness since our budgets are being cut

LynneW: That's right.

DrChristo joined the room.

LynneW: Moving on to another resource.

LynneW: Welcome Dr Christo

DrChristo: Hi.

DrChristo: Sorry I'm late. I finished my office hours, so I came here.

LynneW: You are warmly welcomed.

LynneW: Please introduce yourself.

LynneW: Where are you from and what do you teach?

DrChristo: I'm Elizabeth. I'm a chemistry teacher in Connecticut.

LynneW: Nice to have you join us.

LynneW: Have you been to a Web 2.0 Tools for Schools session before?

DrChristo: Yes, I have.

LynneW: OK - I posted this month's resource links on the desktop of this group room.

DrChristo: Thank you.

LynneW: We have visited mywebspiration.com and dabbleboard.com

LynneW: We are about to visit an E-Mail Generator web site.

SaraDav: cool

LynneW: You can get a free image file of your email address. This is a good idea to use a graphic of your email address posted to anything hosted on the web.

LynneW: Cuts down on you being on the receiving end of monkey business.

SaraDav: I don't think I understand.

LynneW: The link is http://services.nexodyne.com/email/index.php

LynneW: Go ahead and create one. It doesn't take long. Then, let me know when you have returned.

MarleneK: So instead of coding your email into your page with html.. this will supply a graphic of it so you receive less spam

LynneW: Yes

MarleneK: You're an angel Lynne.

LynneW: You save the graphic file it generates and then insert the image wherever you would normally post an email address.

SusanR: I have heard of free email addresses for these sorts of occasions

LynneW: This actually creates a graphic file of your existing email address.

LynneW: Just save in your pictures file and use it whenever it seems appropriate.

LynneW: I have numerous emails so I created several of these.

KellyCM: ok; how do we use in the classroom

LynneW: Just be sure you rename the file when you save it. Otherwise, if you create more than one, it will simply save over.

SaraDav: Good question Kelly.

SaraDav: I was wondering the same thing.

LynneW: Say you had publicly available blogs or a classroom web site.

LynneW: If you have control over the site, you can insert the graphic rather than post your contact email.

MarleneK: it looks eye catching too.. with the gmail logo and such on mine

LynneW: People can see it but malicious bots won't.

SaraDav: ok

LynneW: This may be something only you will use.

KellyCM: Very nice

SaraDav: got it

LynneW: The next resource is Screen Toaster.

LynneW: There are many resources just like it.

LynneW: You can create your own flash files showing a training file.

LynneW: One of those click here and then select this and then do this.

KellyCM: Is this like Voice Thread?

LynneW: I could have created a file that shows you how to join this group or how to use the ACTIONS menu.

LynneW: It records whatever actions you are doing - during the recording session - on your computer.

SaraDav: cool

LynneW: You then share that with whomever you wish.

LynneW: Good tool for instruction of what is appropriate use, etc.

SaraDav: What type of file does it save as?

MarleneK: That would be a great way for kids to make a web bibliography when they are doing web research on a topic.

LynneW: Also good for teaching kids how to complete a particular task in a software program.

SusanR: indeed

LynneW: Sara, I don't remember the file type. I believe you have a couple of choices.

KellyCM: Great for professional development too

LynneW: Yes

SusanR: Is there audio

LynneW: Sue, thanks for the great segue.

LynneW: This next resource I haven't yet tried so beware.

LynneW: Audio Acrobat is a creation tool for audio and video.

LynneW: It may have value for you but use with caution.

LynneW: I trust the source that recommended it however.....

LynneW: http://brpjevach.audioacrobat.com

LynneW: This is the only time I have recommended something I haven't thoroughly vetted. However, my online access is extremely limited these days.

LynneW: I would recommend you try these tools and see if they make sense for you to continue with them.

SusanR: free trial though, Lynne

LynneW: If you actually make something with them, you may remember them.

SaraDav: It's like audacity...

LynneW: Yes, this is one of those programs that may be worth investing in for your school.

LynneW: Or, for you personally.

LynneW: This strays a bit from what I usually share.

LynneW: It was highly recommended at an online conference of teachers.

LynneW: Now, Sue came up with an interesting tool in the E-Portfolios Discussion Group. I thought it might be a nice way to conclude this month's session.

LynneW: Sue, would you like to give a little background and then give us the link?

SusanR: It's using delicious to create a quick and dirty portfolio or eportfolio

SusanR: I will give you the link..tell me what you think

KellyCM: It sounds interesting

SusanR: you are familiar with delicious??

KellyCM: Yes

SaraDav: not really

SusanR: worth exploring Sara

SusanR: at your leisure

KellyCM: Great tool

SaraDav: I'm having a hard time clicking on the link.... help!

LynneW: Delicious is a social bookmarking web site. Services are free and this is my

number one tool of choice.

SaraDav: I have been accessing the other sites through the dashboard

KellyCM: Showed this to my 65 year old dad and he loves it

SusanR: this will explain it simply http://www.commoncraft.com/bookmarking-plain-

english ..look at it later

DrChristo: This is a really great idea!

SaraDav: Help?

LynneW: Sara, I just posted the link with the others.

LynneW: I thought this was a brilliant use of delicious.

SusanR: very creative

LynneW: Please try to remember to post a comment on our discussion board here in the group room if you test this out or use it with students.

SaraDav: I'll have to explore this further...

LynneW: I'm particularly interested in strengths and limitations.

LynneW: Well, as usual, I've pushed a lot at you in a relatively short period of time.

LynneW: Comments, suggestions before our session concludes?

SaraDav: Thanks for letting me sit it.
