DebbieB: hi. I am new to this type of learning

DebbieB: yes, please

BJB2: welcome to the Tapped In community, Debbie!

BJB2: I'm going to give you two suggestions before we begin...

BJB2: go to the Actions menu in the top right of your chat and select larger text

BJB2: and then take a look at the resources that are posted on the welcome screen above the chat

DebbieB: Am I able to stay in this chat at the same time I look at the resources?

BJB2: yep

BJB2: just don't click on any doors

DebbieB: Thank you

SusanR joined the room.

BJB2 waves hi to Sue.

BJB2: Debbie is new to Tapped In, Sue.

SusanR: Welcome Debbie

BJB2: Debbie, the regular discussion leader is not able to log in today. Sue and I will be

covering

BJB2: We usually start all Tapped In discussions with introductions. Can you please tell us where you are located and what you teach?

BJB2: I'm in Pennsylvania and am a retired communication and art teacher

DebbieB: No problem. I am in Wisconsin and I teach 6th grade LA

SusanR: I am in Ottawa, Ontario Canada and I sub

BJB2: did you join Tapped In as part of a course requirement, Debbie?

SusanR: I moderate the K to 3+ Great Resources sessions here

DebbieB: Yes, we were required to visit. I liked it and joined

BJB2 smiles happily...how lovely, Debbie!

BJB2: did you get a chance to look at the stuff on the welcome screen?

SusanR: We are a friendly and supportive community.

BJB2 . o O (quick look)

BJB2 agrees with Sue

DebbieB: I did a quick look as well. Thank you for being so kind.

BJB2: I'd like to show you how to join this group, Debbie...

BJB2: because as a member of the group you will be subscribed to the discussion board where the group leader posts reminders of upcoming events

DebbieB: How does joining help me?

DebbieB: I should have waited.

BJB2 smiles...or I need to learn to type faster!

DebbieB: lol

SusanR: notification of upcoming topics and sessions

BJB2: above this chat is a welcome note.

BJB2: scroll down to the next to the last sentence, This is the group room for Web 2.0 Tools for Schools and click on the green i in that sentence

BJB2: you should then see the group ID page above this chat

BJB2: select join this group

BJB2. o O (joining a group doesn't require anything from you)

DebbieB: I have successfully joined this group

BJB2: and there are not a great deal of posts to the discussion board

BJB2: great!

BJB2: now click on Room View at the top of your screen

BJB2: that brings you back to the welcome screen

DebbieB: Yeah!

BJB2: in the top right of your screen is a drop down menu next to the Go! button

BJB2: drop that menu down and you'll see this group is now listed

BJB2. o O (so joining a group automatically adds the group to your favorite places list)

SusanR claps for Debbie

BJB2: you can use that menu to move to any location listed from any location in Tapped In

DebbieB: I wrote this group down two weeks ago and I logged in earlier just to make sure I could find it. Now I do not have to search for it. Thanks

BJB2: now that we've got the basics finished....go to the Actions menu and select DETACH

EmilyW joined the room.

SusanR: hi Emily

BJB2 waves hi to Emily

EmilyW waves hi

BJB2: detach makes the chat much larger and easier to follow

BJB2: ok, Debbie?

DebbieB: I am all set!

BJB2: Sue, ready to dazzle Debbie? ;-)

SusanR: perfect!!!

BJB2: Lynne did post one site she wanted to share tonight

BJB2: I'm going to show you a url. When you see it hold down the ctrl key on your keyboard when you click on the url

BJB2: http://astore.amazon.com/woltersconsul-20?_encoding=UTF8&node=5

BJB2: the ctrl key overrides pop up blockers

SusanR: I have The Networked Student to share ...a Common Craft style video

BJB2: and a new window should open for you

BJB2. o O (this is a fun site...not very web 2.0, but good for the time of year)

BJB2: I want the Indiana Jones hat

SusanR: now what catches my eye here

BJB2: a personal planetarium might be fun!

DebbieB: I like the programmable scrolling LED name tag

BJB2 laughs...I was just looking at that!

BJB2: very cool!

DebbieB: The portable backup system will come in handy if and when we get the 12 inches of snow they are calling for tonight.

BJB2: oh, gracious!

BJB2: a white Christmas?

BJB2: a snow day?

SusanR: we are expecting 50 cm in some areas

DebbieB: We already have over 24 inches on the ground. We already had one snow day we do not expect another. We have a long winter ahead of us.

EmilyW: haven't seen much snow yet

DebbieB: Emily where are you?

BJB2: we're a little too far south. We'll get some snow, but will turn to rain/freezing rain

EmilyW: DC

BJB2: Sue has some sites to share that are a little more serious.

SusanR: Have you heard of the Common Craft videos

BJB2 . o O (but I'll have to look more closely at that name tag)

BJB2: please tell us more, Sue

SusanR: If you aren't familiar with it, it takes complex ideas and breaks them down into something that is simple and manageable in video format.

SusanR: The videos are short and sweet but you always finish with a more clear understanding of whatever it is that is being presented.

SusanR: Videos on the Common Craft Show range from "Electing a President in Plain English" to "Wikis in Plain English".

SusanR: Most of the videos are related to technology

DebbieB: I want to see the Wikis in Plain English.

BJB2: is there a fee?

SusanR: no fee they are free

SusanR: Here is an example that could be used with grade 5/6 students

SusanR: Web Search Strategies in Plain English

SusanR: they all follow the same format

SusanR: http://commoncraft.com/web-search-strategies

BJB2: who does the videos?

SusanR: good question

BJB2: members of their 'explainers network' :-)

SusanR: Emily, can you answer that

BJB2: http://www.commoncraft.com/network

EmilyW: I have no clue

SusanR: btw there is a fee for site licensing

DebbieB: Am I able to stream this site at my school do you think without purchasing it?

DebbieB: View like I did just now?

SusanR: It is best to embed the code in your blog

DebbieB: Great idea. This way my students can view it at home as well.

BJB2: look at http://commoncraft.com/ There is an explanation in that video

EmilyW left the room (signed off).

SusanR: and here is the explainer network

SusanR: http://www.commoncraft.com/network

DebbieB: I started the Wikis in Plain English. I have seen this before in another class I took at my school. I will use this when we start our shared story writing in a wiki

BJB2: good idea, Debbie

MarleneK joined the room.

BJB2: Hi, Marlene!

MarleneK: Hi, sorry to be late.

SusanR: Here is an actual project completed by Wendy Drexler's high school

SusanR: using the Common Craft style

BJB2 . o O (Lynne isn't able to join us tonight. Sue and I are filling in)

MarleneK nods.

SusanR: It is embedded on Kathy Shrock's site

SusanR: It fits with tonight's topic

SusanR: It is called The Networked Student..see what you think

SusanR: http://kathyschrock.net/blog/2008/12/networked-student.html

SusanR . o O (note the comments too)

MarleneK shall have to peek at that later, everything seems to be running slow tonight.

DebbieB: At this time my school is not able to do most of what is displayed in the video. I wonder if my high school has this capability?

BJB2: why is your school not able to do most of what is displayed, Debbie?

BJB2 . o O (Debbie is in a middle school)

DebbieB: We are working on improving the data connections. My students at this time are not allowed to have email or access anything or anyone externally. I work on this each month.

BJB2: Sue showed us a way for students to use an online site to send work home from school

BJB2 . o O (but don't think the site worked in reverse yet)

BJB2: Debbie, you also might want to look into creating a student classroom in the K-12 Student Campus of Tapped In

DebbieB: I am hoping to use Google Docs some day so we can have access both ways.

DebbieB: I am looking into Tapped In as well. It is on my list for over the holiday break

BJB2: this would allow your students to learn to be accountable and use online social networking in a safe and secure way

BJB2 . o O (kind of hard to learn to drive a car if you don't have a car in which to practice)

SusanR: I am feeling a sense of web 2.0 fatigue amongst teachers

DebbieB: My goal is for my students to see the importance of using the internet and their writing skills at the same time. Not only text messaging language but actually writing something in regular English

BJB2 nods. the students can upload text docs or use the threaded discussion board for reflective writing

BJB2. o O (you can also collaborate with another class in your district or in another district to have book reviews, lit circles, etc)

DebbieB: All great ideas. I am writing down everything.

BJB2 smiles. You do know about the transcripts?

DebbieB: Obviously NO

BJB2: when you log out you will automatically be emailed a transcript of this text chat

MarleneK: Deb, what about using something like Voice Thread in your Literacy Circles, you can use text comments instead of voice.

DebbieB: Yeah! lol

BJB2: the script is sent to the email you have in the member directory

BJB2: ahhh...and, if you create a student classroom and your students log in and have a real time text chat, their transcripts are emailed to you.

SusanR . o O (and now they have video)

SusanR: in VoiceThread

BJB2: when you create a voice thread, is it located at a url?

SusanR: yes

DebbieB: I love all the possibilities

BJB2: so we could post voice threads in Tapped In?

SusanR: I believe so ..and now they have an ed version

SusanR: http://www.edutopia.org/voicethread-interactive-multimedia-albums

MarleneK: Deb, Mapwing is another easy to use site that allows for the opportunity for creative writing.

DebbieB: I subscribe on my reader for edutopia and love their articles. I will look into mapwing

SusanR: Talk to us about mapwing, Marlene.

BJB2 thinks our time is about up. I hope you enjoyed the discussion, Debbie.

DebbieB: Marlene before you go did you do the ribbon snake entry?

BJB2: Thanks, Sue and Marlene, for contributing to the resources.

BJB2 waits for Marlene to answer Sue's request and Debbie's question

DebbieB: Thank you all for my first session on Tapped In. I loved it and will be back.

SusanR: Thanks for your participation.

BJB2: I also suggest you come back to this room when you have time, Debbie, and look more closely at the resources Lynne has provided

DebbieB: Good idea! I hope Marlene is the one who did Zucchini the Ribbon Snake. It is cute

MarleneK: Deb, Yes that one is mine

MarleneK: Sorry my connection is really slow tonight.

MarleneK: Did Grade 1 Tree as well.

DebbieB: Thank you all. I must sign off now. Thank you again

BJB2 . o O (didn't we do a session with mapwing?)

MarleneK: Yes, it should be archived

SusanR: not that I am aware of

SusanR: I would love to see the transcript

B.JB2: voila!

MarleneK: The easiest way to learn how to do a tour, is to make one!

MarleneK: Kids can grab pictures from the internet to use in their tours.

SusanR: That will be on my xmas holiday agenda

BJB2 nods to Marlene. Great, Susan.

MarleneK: Or you can scan their own drawings if you have a scanner or use drawings from Google SketchUP

SusanR: can you upload pics too

MarleneK: nods

BJB2: ok, gals...bedtime for BJ

MarleneK: Because each point on the tour can have 4 or 5 directional points on it.. kids could make a choose your own adventure story.
