BarbaraMu: really appreciate the resources!!

MidgeF: Well, somewhat. But I am retiring in December

BarbaraMu: do any of us really retire????

BJB2: probably not...once an educator, always an educator ;-)

MidgeF: Anyway, after owning a stick of gum shuffle, a Nano and a 5g IPod, I bought a iPod touch in December

MidgeF: I adore it.

MidgeF: Don't be iPod-Challenged!

BJB2 nods to Midge

MidgeF: I already put the link you sent in it, Bj

MidgeF: I can lie on the couch in my bathrobe and check my email and Facebook without using my laptop computer

BJB2: the screen is a decent size

MidgeF: Yes (finally) and my video digital stories look good on it.

MidgeF: My friend gave me a bag that says "It's all about me". It fits very nicely in it with my headphones.

MidgeF: That's my new motto. It's a genealogy thing

BJB2: I'm leading a Storytelling discussion on March 11, Midge, if your hectic schedule allows you to attend

MidgeF: I might. My husband has a dinner to go to that night.

MidgeF: Writing the DST book was quite a nightmare

MidgeF: It won't be published until August.

MidgeF: Soooooo slooooooowwww

MidgeF: I think the ladies like the links they aren't coming back.

MidgeF: I'm sleeping to "White Noise" using my iHome clock radio. It's part of my stress-busting plan.

KellyNF: I'm here

ChristinaG: I'm here too

JenniferNB: me too

MidgeF: Thanks for coming back. Let people out in cyberspace....

MidgeF: OK. so now you know where I put the best stuff I have found so far

MidgeF: I think that this iPod will be the model for future devices (and phones)

BarbaraMu: that's where I was caught...downloading the white noise app

MidgeF: My friend, Tony Vincent, has some great tips and ideas and list of apps for education

MidgeF: I have tried several of them. I still like White Noise the best.

MidgeF: My iPod touch is a second generation which means that it has a small external speaker and volume controls on the side. An iPhone is like a iPod touch but it is a phone and a camera too. Right now iPhones are limited to an AT&T carrier.

BarbaraMu: Loved his title- Learning in Hand!

KellyNF: I hope more services get it...

MidgeF: He was "just" a classroom teacher when I got him to write a lesson for my book

MidgeF: I actually got to meet him. It's such fun to meet people you know online

MidgeF: My son-in-law works in giving hi tech financial stock advise and he says it will be two or three more years on the At&T contract.

MidgeF: I wouldn't switch my carrier so I got this touch

MidgeF: You might be wondering what a iPod touch 2g costs. I checked MacMall which is where I bought mine (but I am a Windows user) for prices. iPods are measured in the number of songs they hold like hospitals are measured in the number of beds in them.

MidgeF: 8G (1, 750 songs) \$218, 16GB (3, 5000 songs) \$280, and 32GB \$374 (\$7,000 songs). Kids full up their digital music players very quickly as they feel they need their entire collection of songs at their fingertips all of the time but I wanted this iPod touch for the ability to use access the wireless in my home and for learning the new "Apps" store.

KellyNF: isn't there an app that allows you to track you friends and be tracked as well?

MidgeF: Kathy told me she talked to some middle school kids who told her that 32 GB

was not big enough for their music.

JeffC remembers WordStar and floppy disks...

MidgeF: I guess Kelly that's a GPS device. It might only be for the iPhone.

KellyNF: oh ok

MidgeF: Jeff, you need to join the Digital Pioneers group at FaceBook

MidgeF: I think I saw that app in a commercial

JeffC: eek... another group!

MidgeF: To track people you'd need the chip in both devices

JeffC: do we sit around and wistfully remember the days of floppy disks and WordStar?

BarbaraMu: think the tracking your friends is totally creepy

MidgeF: Hardly, we complain about the Digital Immigrants paper

BarbaraMu: and we teach boundaries to people how?

MidgeF: I have to tell you, I have already filled 4 screens of apps (out of 9) with great FREE apps

MidgeF: I'm not sure boundaries is part of the new world. Boundaries need to be taught in preschool.

BJB2 . o O (and at home)

MidgeF: What Barbara means is that with all these devices are people going to have problems communicating face to face

BarbaraMu: along with sexting and cyberbullying

MidgeF: But, what needs to happen is educating teachers to how students are using these tools

BarbaraMu: no- not so much about not communicating face to face but the bravado of the anonymity for kids...getting a transfer of whatever character we are trying to teach them being brought into the new world

MidgeF: Kids are VERY fast with learning ways around rules. Always will be, always were

BarbaraMu: yes

BarbaraMu: important for us to know the tools and apps they use

MidgeF: Yes, but they are waiting to teach that until middle school when kids are past listening to adults

MidgeF: I have no idea how teachers are going to keep up

BarbaraMu: tappedin.org?

BJB2 wishes

BarbaraMu: no seriously- thanks for the wonderful resource list

MidgeF: Voice from the young teachers at U Colorado? Speak up

MidgeF: Kelly, Christina and Jennifer

BJB2 wonders if Kelly, Christina and/or Jennifer had any problems with Tapped In or other tech that they've had to use

BJB2 thinks they went out partying and are satisfied to just get the transcript for the assignment;-)

BarbaraMu: or are busy texting friends on their ipods

BJB2 chuckles...perhaps!

MidgeF: LOL Probably

KellyNF: I am kind of just listening to your alls input....I guess I don't see why it is so important for teachers to understand why kids use ipods

KellyNF: do you think they will be school related in the future?

SusanR . o O (wonders if a larger screened ipod touch is about to be released)

MidgeF: That's a good question.

JenniferNB: Ya how are teachers going to use i-pods for teaching purposes?

MidgeF: The newest teachnology for schools is NetBooks

JeffC . o O (hook them up to your smartboard?)

BarbaraMu: podcasts

MidgeF: They are small computers

MidgeF: Yes, and many kids need to listen to books instead of read them

BJB2: Midge included a url in her page about iPods that demos how a teacher used iPods in his special ed class

KellyNF: yeah but teachers and profs are more concerned with keeping our phones away from us at the time being not intergrating them into our work

BJB2: Kelly, that will change...and you are the change agents

MidgeF: That's because higher ed is NOT modeling the future

BarbaraMu: when they are threaded thru a hoodie and the earplug is in the ear, and the information cant get thru for the music, its somewhat problematic to learning, no?

KellyNF: well of course

BarbaraMu: don't know an ADD kid who isn't plugged in during class

KellyNF: I just think it is going to be a difficult transition

MidgeF: I can think of plenty of people I'd like to block out with my earbuds

MidgeF: It is...but it's been going on for a long time now and there's still not enough change happening

JeffC agrees with Midge.

BarbaraMu: I agree teachers are the change agents to make the technology viable as a learning tool think elementary folks most open but most exciting at higher levels

MidgeF: Obsession with standardized testing is a big problem

BarbaraMu: it is...can we create a standardized test app that has to be more satisfying than the rote drill??

MidgeF: What people are learning will not help with the future of learning

BarbaraMu: that's a compelling statement Midge!

KellyNF: so if everyone knows standardized testing is not helpful why are we so

concerned about it.

BJB2 smiles sadly

BarbaraMu: W's obsession

BarbaraMu: dragged in 8 years ago from Texas as THE answer

MidgeF: Keeping kids in school, making high school diploma a necessity and making tax paying citizens happy

KellyNF: even in one of my classes we were talking about how college used to not have grades and the point was to come out as a better thinker, now it is all about good grades to go get your masters or whatever

MidgeF: Kelly, you have good thoughts

MidgeF: When I was an undergrad only those who wanted to be admins got a Masters

KellyNF: really

MidgeF: Remember, the circle of money. Get a Master's to keep higher ed in business

MidgeF: That money goes back to the state and back to K-12.

MidgeF: The stuff they don't tell you in college!

MidgeF: I love being self employed

JeffC doesn't have a Masters... didn't need one when he started teaching... now, thanks to NCLB... can't even get credentialed here in Oregon (even though he has a professional clear in California).

MidgeF: I am 61 and got my Master's 3 years ago. No one will hire me because I don't have a Doctorate

JeffC: lol

JeffC wonders if the kids in this room ever saw the movie "Paper Chase."

MidgeF: Did you just run screaming from the room Kelly!

MidgeF: That's why some of the best people are being kept from teaching young teachers about technology
